1.	What changes in behavior, actions, policies or practices have you observed related to SIA implementation during the 2021-22 school year? How do you see these changes contributing to the goals and outcomes in your SIA plan? (500 words or less)	As the needs of the school changed due to Covid, the use of SIA funds changed. We submitted changes that were approved from our original proposal Yet, they were within the goals of our SIA plan.
2.	What barriers or challenges to SIA implementation have you experienced that are helpful for your community and/or state leaders to be aware of? What adjustments, if any, did you make to your SIA plan as a result of these challenges? (500 words or less)	The barriers were the restrictions from Covid. Supply chains made materials harder to get and more costly in many cases. Due to a limited opportunity to find a school nurse, we had a very hard time contracting a nurse and that ended up for only about half of the year.

How have relationships with or between those groups changed and/or been maintained throughout this academic year? (500 words or less)	The community was open to providing feedback, predominant through surveys and virtual meetings. The district decided to make some changes in the activities to support student learning from the survey results. As a result, many activities needed adjustment to contribute to the support of the students and their needs. Central Curry does a good job of keeping the community informed. All focal groups are targeted to receive messages from the school and be engaged in surveys and public meetings. So engagement maintained its normal efforts to keep the school and community informed.
4.	As you think about what guided your choices and prioritization efforts in this year of SIA implementation, what stands out? How will what you've learned this year impact future SIA implementation efforts? (500 words or less)	We needed to improve our network infrastructure which then allowed us to use all the new devices we had purchased for students. The biggest investment was on personnel. We have a counselor, teacher, and a maintenance worker all under SIA. Each provided a necessary service to the students and community alike through their various jobs. We will continue to use SIA to support these individuals and also our IT network for infrastructure.
