Controls in the Workplace

Based on the exposure risk assessment efforts, the following controls have been implemented in our facilities: Controls for specific tasks and activities are listed in the job tables in the pages that follow. Controls may include ventilation, staggered shifts, redesign of the task or work environment, limited occupancy and reduction of shared tools/equipment.

Face Covering Requirements

Face Covering Types	Locations Where Required
Face masks that cover the nose and mouth, following CDC requirements	All workspaces, both indoors and outdoors. This includes classrooms, common areas, buses and offices
Face shields that cover the nose and mouth and to the forehead, following CDC requirements	Classrooms in situations where medical conditions prevent the use of a face mask; During instruction when the student needs to see the mouth and tongue motions in order to communicate.

Notifications of Known or Suspect COVID-19 Cases

In the event an employee or employees are exposed to a known or suspected case of COVID-19 through contract tracing, notification will occur. The District protocol is based on the guidance of the Oregon Health Authority and the Oregon Department of Education. The event in the workplace is reported by telephone and/or text with a follow-up email to the public health officer with the Curry County Health Department who then directs to District on next steps which may include quarantine and contract tracing.

Management will ensure a general communication is provided to the workplace at large via email and that any other employers with employees on the premises are notified. The ICP Administrator

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(superintendent) will ensure that notifications and communications occur within 24 hours of the district being notified.

Supplies - Locations

All supplies are kept in stock in the following locations. Employees are responsible for notifying the appropriate persons when supplies are getting low. An inventory of supplies is conducted monthly but supplies may become low before that time.
